

According to a new report commissioned by Missouri Foundation for Health, if Medicaid were expanded in Missouri, the average yearly economic impacts (2022-26) from the increase in federal funding would lead to:

## **Job Growth**

averaging **16,330** 

new jobs created each year

## **Growth Benefitting the Whole State**

63.7%

of new jobs would be outside of Kansas City and St. Louis



Employment Growth Beyond Health Care

79% of new jobs would be outside of the health care industry



## State Economic Benefits
