Putting Automated Driving Systems to the Test: a Collaborative **Research Framework**

Dr. Filmon Habtemichael. Battelle

Once a sci-fi fantasy, self-driving cars are today's reality. But keeping the streets safe requires extensive testing of these automated driving systems (ADSs) - from test tracks to public roads. By working together, ADS developers and Infrastructure Owners and Operators can improve testing, help identify problems and solutions, and speed up the deployment of ADSs across the country. Dr. Filmon Habtemichael, a research scientist at Battelle, will break down the Framework project - a research framework developed by the Federal Highway Administration to foster that critical collaboration.

Future of Railroad

It's been a big year for railroad in Missouri. In April, the merger of Canadian Pacific Railway and Kansas City Southern established the first and only single-line transnational railroad linking Canada, the U.S. and Mexico. In June, Gov. Parson signed House Bill 4, which included \$50 million in funding to improve safety at Missouri's public railroad crossings. Learn about the impact of these major events and hear how improved railway efficiency and capacity will ensure supply chain stability for the entire nation.
