We heard you loud and clear: *No issue in the* past decade has posed a greater threat to Missouri businesses than Proposition A.

That's why the Missouri Chamber of Commerce and Industry made Prop A reform our top priority during the 2025 legislative session. And thanks to your support, we succeeded.

With the passage of House Bill 567, we've delivered critical relief to Missouri's business community. This legislation removes Proposition A's burdensome paid sick leave mandate while maintaining the \$15 minimum wage. It eliminates annual wage increases tied to the Consumer Price Index, giving employers greater predictability in managing labor costs.

The bill, sponsored by Rep. Sherri Gallick (R-Belton) and handled by Sen. Mike Bernskoetter (R-Jefferson City), will take effect August 28, pending Gov. Mike Kehoe's signature.

From the Capitol to the courtroom, the Missouri Chamber led the fight for reform. We built and mobilized a grassroots coalition of over 550 businesses from across the state that advocated for changes to Proposition A.
